Just 7km out of Katherine on Gorge Road, Top Didj offers a unique Indigenous culturally rich experience like no other. Artist Manuel Pamkal from the Dalabon tribe will share his culture and stories during a fantastic two and a half hour interpretative presentation.



Take home a woven basket.



Manuel teaches the art of spear throwing.



Learn how to make fire without a match.



Interact with wallabies.



Buy a didgeridoo.



Purchase a piece of Indigenous art for the home.

‘There’s a range of hands-on experiences for people to enjoy. He’ll teach them how to make fire with two sticks, throw a spear with a woomera and create their own rarrk painting to take home,’ said Top Didj owner Petrena. Twice daily, Brolga award-winning Aboriginal artist Manuel also talks about his family, cultural differences, tribal life, growing up in the bush, living off the land and weapons used, plays the didgeridoo and explains the significance of rarrk painting (cross-hatching). ‘As we’re members of Katherine Wildlife Rescue there’s always the opportunity to interact with wallabies by feeding the bigger ones sweet potato and holding the joeys too.’ The Art Gallery holds an excellent collection from Arnhem Land, the Kimberley and Central Western Desert. You can view and purchase some of the best Indigenous art and didgeridoos in the Territory. Top Didj also offers catering for small or large groups, and the experience is a perfect addition to school excursions and conference groups. There’s something for everyone at Top Didj.
